Year 7 Classroom Programme

This term, we will start with a week on our year-long unit, Who we are, before finishing our fourth inquiry unit, How we express ourselves. As we move through the unit of inquiry, students will participate in a range of learning experiences that involve using their imagination, senses, and feelings to respond to questions, ideas or opinions before starting to begin a student-led inquiry into an area of personal choice and take action. Our Year 7 and Year 8 classes are in the process of presenting their oral language presentations, so ask your child about this to learn more.

Year 8 Classroom Programme

Our Year 8 classrooms are halfway through their Where we are in place and time unit of inquiry. They will begin personal inquiries into wonderings or questions they developed from our provocations and incursions. Our Year 7 and Year 8 classes are in the process of presenting their oral language presentations, so ask your child about this to learn more. In Week 4, we move into our final unit of inquiry, How we express ourselves before the exhibition begins in Week 10. More information about both units will be shared in the next newsletter.

CULTURAL MARKET DAY AND MUFTI DAY

On Friday 18th August at 12:45pm, we will be running a Cultural Market Day. Students have applied to have stalls and sell items like food and drink of different cultures. We will also have a mufti day for students to wear cultural clothing to promote awareness of the many cultures we have at BBI.



MAORI KNOWLEDGE-A-THON 2023

As part of our New Zealand Curriculum, we are required to learn languages. One of the languages we are learning at BBI is Te Reo, as it is one of the 3 Official Languages of New Zealand. To connect with Aotearoa's Māori culture, we are also running our annual Māori Knowledge-a-thon. The students will learn the Knowledge-a-thon answers, and then in Week 5, on Friday 18th August, we will have a school-wide test. We will have a prize draw for those students who score 98% or more. Hopefully, this will encourage our students and their whānau to learn some keywords and phrases in Te Reo and about Māori culture.
