## **YEAR 8 UNIT OF INQUIRY**

On Friday 5th May, our Year 8 students will experience a unique learning provocation focused on aspects of World War I and II. The passionate facilitator holds a Bachelor of Arts majoring in Defence studies, specialising in Military History and Counter-terrorism. This exhibition of artefacts will be set up at school and is directly related to the unit of inquiry which will commence later this term. Groups of two classes will participate in a 40-minute session where the history and knowledge of the collection will be shared. Former students have found this opportunity highly engaging.

The one-day programme is an extension of the well-established charitable interactive history programme run for the past nine years. Having gone through a rigorous evaluation process, the Evolution of Firearms programme has been vetted and approved by New Zealand Police.

#### **SCHOOL ROUTINE**

It is really important that students are at school on time and ready for the day to start at 8.40am. Ideally, all students should be here by 8.30am in order to be changed for fitness on fitness days, and be organised for the school day. If you live further away, please ensure that you leave home in time for students to be at school on time.

- Students should arrive between 8.10am and 8.30am daily. All teachers will meet students in the classroom by 8.20am.
- **Students arriving late** Please ensure that students sign in at the office if they arrive at school late. Parents do not need to come to the office with the student.

- **Absences** If a student is absent for the day, please phone the school office 095342896, before 8.40am and leave a message on the absence line. Please send a note to the classroom teacher with the student. The student is to leave the class, and wait at the office at the arranged time to be collected. Students will sign themselves out. Except for in an emergency, please do not come to the office and ask for the student to be found to go home early.
