FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL IN THE SPORTS CLOUD

A SPECIAL REPORT: Moving to a New School

Moving to a new school is a big deal! Your child is going to meet new people. That's bound to be different emotions. They may feel worried and anxious, but also excited and happy – all at the same time!

It is considered to be one of the most important transition periods of a student's life and can present some significant psychological challenges for both students and parents.



Making new friends, learning new routines, discovering new environments, accepting new cultures and adjusting to new learning practices is all part of the process. Some children will sail through this period of change, whilst others may need a bit more guidance. It is important to give your child the chance to feel comfortable in their new space. This may take a few months, but ensure you keep the lines of communication open and check in regularly with your child to see how they are settling in.

STATIONERY

Students will bring stationery lists home on the first day of school. Please take time to go through all of this with them. We endeavour to keep our stationery at a reasonable level and price. PARENT PORTAL

It is important that parents can access the Parent Portal via our website. Currently, the portal is used for communication, making payments, and accessing school reports. You will have received a reminder by email of your Portal log in and your password. Please keep this in a safe place. Charges for stationery, Camp etc will be loaded on to the Parent portal by Friday 26 January. For your convenience and sustainability, we are now including online permissions. Should you be unable to log in, please email office@bbi.school.nz with your child's details so we can reset your password.

SCHOOL ROUTINE

- Students should arrive between 8.10am and 8.30am daily. All teachers will meet students in the classroom by 8.20am.

- Absences If a student is absent for the day, please phone the school office 095342896, before 8.40am and leave a message on the absence line. Please do not email, as emails are not always cleared, and staff may be absent on the day. All unaccounted absences are followed up first thing in the morning.
- Students leaving school during school hours Our students are encouraged to take responsibility
 for themselves. We also endeavour to keep classroom disruption to a minimum. Please send a note
 with details to the classroom teacher with the student. At the arranged time, the student will leave
 class, sign themselves out at the office, and wait to be collected at the arranged time. Except for
 emergencies, please do not come to the office and ask for the student to be found to go home early
 etc.

UNIFORM

Commencing **Week Two** and for the duration of **Term One only**, students may travel to and from school wearing their P.E. uniform. If students choose this option, sports shoes must also be worn. Students may change into their formal uniform during the day. Formal uniform should be worn to and from school on Mondays and Fridays, unless a student has P.E. as their final lesson of the day. School uniform should be clean, tidy, and worn with pride . **Please ensure that all uniform items and hats are clearly named.** Any uniform items left around the school will be placed in the lost property box located outside Room 2. Please be aware that we expect all students to be sun safe by wearing their hat at P.E. and during break times.

SUN SAFETY FUNDRAISER

This year, BBI is running two fundraisers to help promote sun safety at school. We will sell whānau coloured bucket hats and polarised sunglasses. The bucket hats can be purchased as part of the stationery packs at the beginning of the year, which can be purchased on the Parent Portal. Meanwhile, the sunglasses will be sold at school once they arrive; more information to follow shortly. These polarised sunglasses are priced at \$10.00 each. The sunglasses come in black frames with a limited number of yellow and whiten frames. It is a timely reminder that hats should be worn at morning tea, and lunchtime, as well as during PE and fitness sessions. We strongly encourage students to apply sunscreen each day before they leave home in the morning and then reapply at our sunscreen station at school later in the day.

PARKING / STOPPING Bucklands Beach Road is a busy road. If possible, please encourage your child to walk to and from school. Alternatively, your child could be dropped off and picked up at a point close to school. **Please**



note that St John's Church next door to us also runs a kindergarten and is <u>NOT</u> to be used as a pick up or drop off point.

PROPERTY

Thank you to the School Board and all the Property people for making our school look fantastic. A number of building works have been taking place during the school holidays. The Board is funding the build of two new classrooms, plus a new cultural and meeting room. There has also been remedial work on weathertightness to the Performing Arts Centre and Music Room. The exterior of the school has been painted, which occurs every 10 years or so. Although some of the work is yet to be completed, we have good systems in place to ensure that there is as little disruption as possible. We hope our students are proud of their school.
